Note: Egypt also enabled air-evacuation/medical care for some Gaza patients and brokered ceasefire talks; those humanitarian/diplomatic acts are real. The table isolates acts/omissions with foreseeable *adverse* effects on civilian protection to maintain legal clarity.

Oct–Nov 2023	Tight control of Rafah corridor while hundreds of aid trucks remained stuck in Egypt (Al-Arish/Rafah) amid Israel-run inspection bottlenecks (Nitzana/Kerem Shalom). 2023–2025 (speech/assembly)	Sustained constraints on rallies and media concerning Gaza within Egypt during escalating atrocities (arrests, tight protest permitting). Example baseline: https://www.reuters.com/world/middle-east/egypt-detains-protesters-gaza-supporters-cairo-2023-10-20/	Contributed to the regional information blackout and suppression of pressure campaigns.	Documented enforcement and arrests.	Contribution to persecution (Art. 25(3)(d)).	Same.
2024–2025 (energy)	Regional gas flows to Egypt/Jordan repeatedly influenced by conflict disruptions; Egypt retained leverage via energy interconnects and terminals but did not deploy coercive measures against belligerent backers.
